

# Student rights and responsibilities within the doctoral programme in artistic research

## Rights

- To study full time for the period financed by the Ministry of Culture and Education or by the partner university.
- To participate in the planning of the doctoral programme by initiating ideas concerning the teaching and collaboration with other doctoral students.
- To initiate personal learning goals.
- To receive individual supervision and feedback from the supervisors within the doctoral programme.
- To be part of the multidisciplinary group formed by the doctoral students and receive peer support.
- To organize collectively teaching events, workgroups and seminars as agreed.
- To apply for travel grants, grants for translation and production costs from the funds of the doctoral programme.
- To have access to work spaces and facilities in the participating universities within the resources available for research purposes.

## Responsibilities

- To participate in all teaching organized by the doctoral programme and to carefully complete all assignments given.
- To assist in organizing the doctoral programme teaching events.
- To study full time. Additional time and energy consuming projects will be avoided. Eventual other projects need to be agreed upon by the board of the doctoral programme. The board will also be informed about any essential issue that might affect the progress of the research project.
- In conjunction with the work plan, to separately negotiate with the head of the department the work obligation part included in the assignment. The obligation amounts to the maximum of 5 per cent out of the total work expected, with the aim to integrate the doctoral programme in the activities of one's own department.
- To take responsibility in updating the research plan and the personal study plan, and to agree on supervision in one's own university.
- To create a work plan covering the doctoral programme period, and in each seminar to report the steps taken and the goals achieved after the previous seminar. To discuss the progress of one's research project with the representative of the board once a year.
- To inform the supervisors about the doctoral programme and to invite them to contribute to the programme.
- To represent the doctoral programme in one's university and other research communities and events. To advocate the participation in the programme in all publicly available information about one's research.
- To update the information about one's research project on the web page of the programme.
- To respect intellectual property rights and ethical issues in the research project.
- To stay on schedule in one's research project.
